Your executive committee has taken this matter under advisement and at its February 4, 2015 meeting passed a motion to recommend to our members that we seek official recognition as the 'Windsor Essex Centre' of the Royal Canadian College of Organists. We acknowledge that many centres draw members from outside of their city or town limits, but it was felt that since two thirds of our members and friends reside in Essex County communities and more and more our region is being referred to as Windsor Essex, we should reflect our demographics and keep current with changing trends.

The executive committee also recognizes that such an important decision requires support from a majority of its constituents and in keeping with good governance practices, will consult and respect the wishes of its membership. To this end, a motion to change the name of our centre will be put forward to the Annual General Meeting on June 5, 2015 and a vote on the motion will be taken. All voting members present will have an opportunity to ask questions about the motion and have their vote recorded.


